

The 3 pillars of our MAP

One - Building for the Future

Our goal is to make St Peter's a place that captures the wonder of its heritage while, at the same time, upgrading our building and facilities to be more accommodating and accessible.

2023 sees the vision we have been developing for many years become a reality through our SPRING (St Peter's Reworked – Inspiring New Growth) Project. We have delivered several important aspects of our plan already such as upgraded LED lighting in church, a new boiler, refurbished and accessible toilets, new

kitchen, and new vestries. Now we are embarking on the major initiative of new flooring in the main church. Not only will this preserve this beautiful building, it will also create a new, flexible space for our wider community.

Through careful stewardship over the years we are in the fortunate position of being able to fund most of the essential work we need to upgrade our building, but we have a gap. We have established a fundraising team with a goal to raise £150,000 by the end of January 2024 and have a number of initiatives planned to enable the church and wider community to support these vital plans.

Work begins in Summer 2023, at which time our main building will close.

We will encourage our community to 'jump in', learn new skills and make a difference through our many opportunities to volunteer and get involved, including welcoming, flower-arranging, tech and AV, gardening, children and youth leads and supporters and more!

We will establish a team of assistant church wardens to support the ongoing work of our church and prepare for the changes we will see in 2023 and 2024.

We will celebrate our volunteers in special services and raise awareness of the depth of opportunities to volunteer throughout the year.

Three - Build Church and Community Engagement

To build our church and wider community we will focus on our work with children, youth and families, discipleship, worship, and pastoral care. This is all underpinned by our communications activities.

As we plan for the renovation of our building and our move to share Marlborough Road Methodist Church, we will focus on bringing our community together throughout that time and will host a 'Big Community Launch' when we reopen in 2024. Our communications team will focus on keeping St Peter's involved in the community throughout and engage with local organisations to explore how we can make the most of our wonderful new space in the heart of the city.



Children Youth and Families:

- Our goal is to engage, encourage and empower those aged 0-18 and their families as they encounter God on their spiritual journey. We aim to:
 - **Engage** Children, Young People and their families in age appropriate activities throughout the year in order to bring them into their own relationship with God. These include (but not limited to) Junior Church, Messy Church, SPY, Family Time, Family socials, Baby and Toddler time, those bringing children to be baptised and through the local schools.
 - Encourage Children, young people and their families to feel like they belong to the community
 of faith at St Peter's as they encounter God in new and different way, as well as grow a team of
 volunteers to help with the work.
 - **Empower** Children, Young people and their families by giving them the tools needed to continue to grow in faith and encounter God for themselves as they find their voice and place in the Christian community.

Discipleship:

- Our goal for discipleship is to grow a church family across all ages called to learn together in love and fellowship and inspired in our exploration and development of faith, so that we can live God's gift of life today with increasing confidence.
- Following two years of relative isolation experienced by many in our church family as a result of the pandemic, we will seek to offer opportunities for shared learning and development of faith in ways which suit the diverse circumstances and concerns of individuals.

- We will encourage regular, occasional and new members of our congregations to consider joining a home group to enjoy the fellowship and faith development which they can provide.
- We will organise and resource courses for inquirers where there is demand, ongoing development of faith courses, and Lent Groups, considering collaboration with one or more other city centre churches where it seems appropriate.

Worship:

We are creating and sustaining patterns of worship that are inspiring, accessible, and enable all to engage in offering who we are to God.

In building on an established heritage of thoughtful, well led and mixed worship styles we will continue to review and update service patterns and literature; enhance our all-age focus; make better use of our space; and grow our sense of enabling others to join in and lead. We will know we have succeeded when the style and feel of worship becomes more accessible, others become more involved, and our space and logistics have been developed to enhance our worship at St Peter's.



Pastoral care:

• Our pastoral care is primarily led by a team of people who share responsibility for the well-being of those involved in aspects of church life. However, we all share the call to support, encourage and care for one another and those within our community. Therefore, we will maintain and enhance our ongoing work in supporting those who are not normally able to attend services, nurturing and supporting those who attend regularly and providing a caring social environment including the more elderly or lonely (with or without connections to the church). We shall also offer bereavement support from the Bereavement Team. Above all, we would like to develop further our reputation as a friendly and caring church.

St Peter's - COVID 19 experience Reflections and Planning

What have we lost in the last 4 months that must remain lost?

- Time pressures / overwork (for some), the hustle and bustle!
- Overdependence on fewer people to achieve things -
- Paper, paper, paper dramatically reduced reliance on paper
- Rigid church structure / culture
- Emerging themes for focus (to review in context of MAP):
- Processes (paper / staff / volunteering) - Carolyn
- External engagement (building, community, fringe, access, music) – Carolyn and Alex
- Children and Youth
- Channels (digital, communication, website, branding) - Alex
- Worship (funerals, baptisms, hymn books etc, music) – Ministry team

What have we lost in the last few months that we must regain in the weeks and months ahead?

- Funerals number of church families missed the last wishes / usual ceremony.
- Our own personal confidence in returning to face to face situation – comfort with return to normal
- Human contact
- Music The choir / singing / concerts
- Home groups
- Income / funding
- Access to the building regain a sense of home, inviting people and finding ways to welcome people back in and comfortable
- Community activities, external focus (lunch time concerts, baby group, Tea on Tuesday)
- Contact with those on the 'fringe' (those outside core church attendees e.g. confirmation group, infrequent attendees)

What has been gained in the last few months that must now be retained or developed?

- More people supporting activities and events - need to maintain this engagement (Lara)
- Digital engagement: tech skills;
 Capacity for wider reach, different ways of connecting with people as a church body and individual to individual, new networks
- Children and youth connections
- Thoughtful themes: More care and attention to ensure each service has a theme – thinking more thematically
- More accessible to the very busy and those at home
- Electronic giving regular donations (Standing orders / DD / cashless)
- Flexible working for staff
- More frequent and effective and online Management and Ministry team meetings
- Prioritising the important connections, community, individuals
- Trust in financial accounting system

What has been gained that was fine for the season – but can now be lost?

- Over reliance on Zoom, everything digital - Some personal '3 dimensional' contact is needed
- We need to achieve a balance of communication channels to meet the needs of the congregation

Take opportunity now to review services and servers: Servers every Sunday – just high days and holidays? Let's see how this significant event can inform the future of the church from reviewing pattern of services, what hymn books we need to defining what sort of church we are. We have an opportunity now to shape the future....
